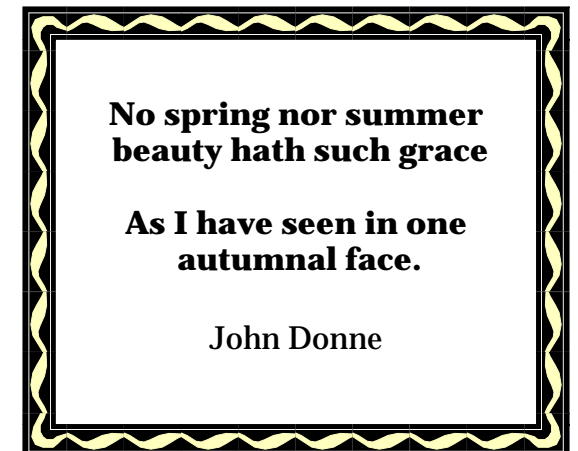
Important Information!

A MESSAGE FROM SOCIAL SERVICES



Your rights to stay in your facility

Part One

You have the right to keep living in your facility, unless your facility forces you to move because you are dangerous to yourself or others, for medical reasons, you have not paid or are late paying your bill, or your facility closes.

You must be given written notice (*Notice of Involuntary Transfer or Discharge Pursuant to the Nursing Home Care Act*), if your facility wants to remove you from the facility. Ask for it or, by moving and not receiving it, you may be agreeing to a voluntary transfer to another facility. If requested, the notice must:

- Tell you why your facility wants you to move
- Tell you how to appeal to the Illinois Department of Public Health
- Provide a stamped and addressed envelope for you to mail your appeal in; and
- Be received 30 days prior to the day they want you to move from a Medicare or Medicaid certified facility; or
- Be received 21 days prior to the day they want you to move from a State licensed facility

You have the right to appeal to the Illinois Department of Public Health and if you choose to appeal:

- A Department of Public Health hearing officer will travel to your facility to hear why you believe you should stay in the facility and why the facility believes you should move and
- Usually your facility cannot make you leave until the appeal is decided by the Department of Public Health

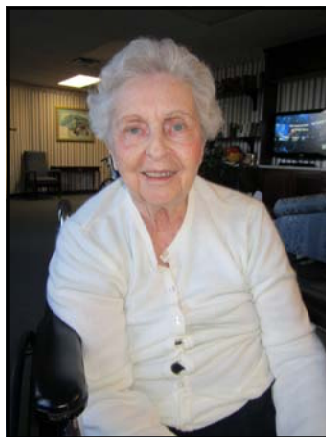

RECIPE FROM HOME

Chocolate Chip Pound Cake



Ingredients:

- 1 (18.25 ounce) package yellow cake mix
- 1 (3.9 ounce) package instant chocolate pudding mix
- 1/2 cup white sugar
- 3/4 cup water
- 3/4 cup vegetable oil
- 4 eggs, beaten
- 1 cup sour cream
- 1/2 cup milk chocolate chips
- 1/8 cup confectioner's sugar



Preparation:

1. Preheat oven to 325 degrees
2. Grease and flour a 10 inch Bundt pan
3. In a medium bowl, stir together cake mix, instant pudding and sugar. Add the water, oil, eggs and sour cream, mix until well blended.
4. Fold in the chocolate chips and our into Bundt pan.
5. Bake for 50 to 60 minutes in the preheated oven. Cool in pan for 10 minutes before inverting it out of pan.
6. Dust with confectioner's sugar

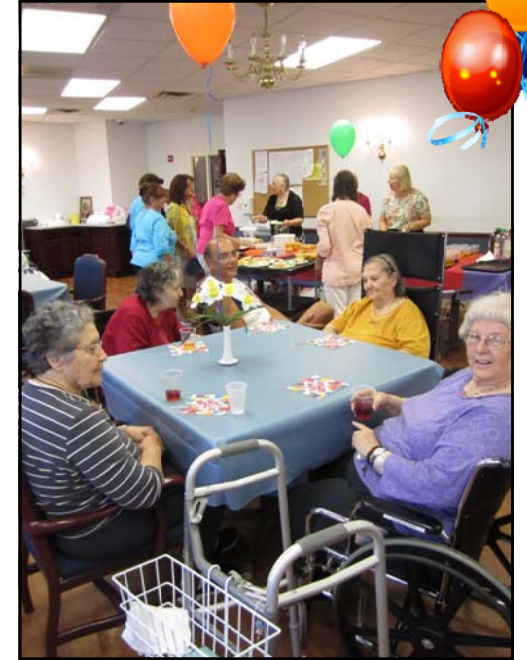
